<p><b>Latrine Fund:</b></p> <p>There is a vast ongoing need to fund latrines throughout Central America in order to improve sanitary conditions near home-sites and in communities. Funding for latrine building is relatively difficult since water projects are much more popular to support. Global Water funds latrine building along with most of its water projects, but often, there is not enough money to do both and we are unable to build enough latrines for the entire community. Therefore, Global Water has established a Latrine Fund specifically to support sanitation projects throughout Central America. The following depicts typical latrine building information:</p>
